## University Wide Seminar with Dr. S. James Gates Jr.

Undergraduate Studies is proud to announce a University-Wide Seminar not to be missed. Nationally renowned scientist in String Theory, Dr. S. James Gates Jr, will be at the Memorial Student Center on **December 4th**. He has been featured extensively on NOVA PBS programs. Dr. Gates is a Toll Professor of Physics and Director of the Center for String and Particle Theory at the University of Maryland in College Park. He serves on President Obama's Council of Advisors on Science and Technology.

The U.S. Presidents Council of Advisors on Science & Technology (PCAST) issued a report entitled Engage to Excel in 2012 to describe the need for transformation in the first two years of post-secondary education in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) fields. Recommendations from this report will be presented by Dr. Gates.

## France Study Abroad

Are you interested in studying abroad? Texas A&M and the Ecole Supérieure d'Agriculture in Angers, France, offer a unique opportunity for undergraduate students to experience the French way of life and to learn about the culture of food production and consumption in France. During a month-long trip, the students are exposed to a series of lectures on specifics of food production, processing, and distribution in France. Additional lectures discuss France's role in the European Union, its history, and the rich heritage of French culture. Field trips and cultural visits are a major part of the program providing the students with an up-close experience of French agriculture and food industry. The program is administered entirely in English, though students do learn the basics of the French language. Students live with host families and have an opportunity to participate in their everyday activities.
