Program Description

The courses taught on this program are related to diffusion and other innovative practices for sustainable development and biodiversity. Students experience firsthand practices and principles of technological change in the international and rural environment of Costa Rica. Undergraduates will develop case studies and multimedia components that reflect technological change in Costa Rica. Graduate students will be trained on the use of participatory rural appraisal to collect need assessment data in the local community. This program is open to all majors.
