Please be advised that the National Corn Growers Association (NCGA) is again offering its William C. Berg Academic Excellence in Agriculture Scholarship thanks to the sponsorship of BASF Corporation.

Five (5) one thousand dollar (\$1,000) scholarships are available to students entering at least their second undergraduate year (or any year of graduate school) pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree in an agricultural, agribusiness, or an ag vocation field.

50th Anniversary of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Texas A&M University will host a major interdisciplinary symposium commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 on Thursday, Nov. 6 in Rudder Theatre. The symposium, "Global Citizens and Equality: 50 Years After the 1964 Civil Rights Act," will more critically interrogate this momentous piece of legislation, through research and scholarship—a hallmark of Texas A&M University's flagship mission.

During the symposium, speakers and panelists from multiple disciplines will examine various research issues surrounding civil rights and equality in many U.S. institutions, including those considered within the 1964 Civil Rights Act, such as race and gender in education and employment, as well as those not considered, such as disparities in the criminal justice system, LGBTQ issues, and immigration issues.
