#### Action/Discussion Items

1) Approval of Minutes from the March meeting – Tim Murphy

Motion was made by Scott Cummings, Second by Gary Wingenbach to "Approve the March minutes with ALEC 695 teaching assignments corrected." Correction:

#### Old Business

Mentioned again -- It was determined in previous meetings that ALEC 695 online would have different faculty teaching it on a rotation. Dr. Odom volunteered to teach the online section Spring 2013 during the January meeting. The on-campus section for Spring 2013 still needs to be covered.

Motion passed unanimously to correct minutes. Minutes will be available on the ALEC Intranet.

As part of this discussion, Dr. Robert Strong volunteered to teach the on-campus section of ALEC 695 in Spring 2013. The spring schedule will reflect these teaching assignments when ready to submit.

- 2) Accessing Travel Support from D@D Funds Tim Murphy (Attachment A)

  A handout was provided containing guidelines for the allocation of D@D funds. There are limited funds for travel from this budget. Funding may be available to support travel associated with the D@D meetings following these guidelines. Requests for funding should be directed to Dr. Murphy.
- 3) Distance Delivery of the ALEC Ph.D. Tim Murphy, James Lindner Open discussion. Dr. Murphy mentioned that a proposal is under development to offer the Ph.D. program via distance delivery. Dr. James Lindner is in charge of developing this proposal. The Coordinating Board review is not as cumbersome as in the past. Faculty voiced concerns about offering a distance Ph.D. Some feel the need to give doctoral students F2F teaching experience in order to keep them marketable, and a distance Ph.D. will limit this.

We have an increasing number of on-campus students taking online courses. Currently, students may take a maximum of 50% of their courses online. This number must be monitored carefully to ensure this limit is not surpassed.

Dr. Lindner would like to establish a committee to meet and develop the proposal. He proposed meeting for  $\frac{1}{2}$  day to work on this item. If you would like to be part of this committee, please let Dr. Lindner know by May 25.

- 4) Graduate Student Sample Advising Sheets Tim Murphy, James Lindner
  Open discussion. The sample advising sheets were re-formatted 6 months ago from the 2008 versions. Some faculty
  feel the information is confusing. Clarice and Dr. Murphy will develop new forms to bring back to the Graduate
  Faculty for review. The current forms are available on the ALEC Web page under degree programs or available on
  the ALEC Intranet. If you wish to provide any suggestions, please let Clarice or Dr. Murphy know by May 18.
- 5) Departmentally-funded Graduate Assistants for Fall 2012 Tim Murphy
  Dr. Murphy mentioned that Dr. Reed verbally confirmed that state-funded assistantships will be able to cover tuition
  for the Fall 2012 only. Dr. Murphy has adjusted the offer letters. Please provide Dr. Murphy with your rankings for
  possible assistantships. Individuals applying to assistantship positions are available to review on the ALEC Intranet.
  He will also advertise open positions through the AAAE listserv.

#### **New Business**

Qualifying Exams - Gary Wingenbach

Open discussion. Dr. Wingenbach feels that a qualifying exam should be part of the campus doctoral degree programs because it is a good indicator of the students' competency. The D@D program already has one in place, and the same format could be used. Possibly specific research courses could be taken prior to completion of 30 credit hours, and these courses would then be part of the qualifying exam.

This item will be placed on the agenda as an action/discussion item at the next Graduate Faculty meeting.

#### Informational Items

1) IRB Regulations – James Lindner

Dr. James Lindner is now on the IRB review board. As part of this committee, he has seen extensive reviews of the documents. He suggests that you streamline your information and provide only necessary information, do not get too detailed. It will delay the review. He also indicated to not list your student on the signature page. List only the faculty member as the PI.

2) Collegiality and Professionalism – Dr. Wingenbach

Dr. Gary Wingenbach shared his concern about committee chair changes taking place well into a students' graduate program. Students meet with other faculty members, and get different opinions about the process of completing their degree program. Students should meet with all members of their committee prior to changing the committee. Faculty members should contact the current Chair prior to accepting a position on a reconstituted committee.

Dr. Tracy Rutherford moved to adjourn. Seconded by Gary Wingenbach. Meeting adjourned.

#### Guidelines for the Allocation of D@D funds

In 2008, when the Department made a strategic initiative to continue the D@D program, COALS allocated approximately \$20,000/yr. to the Department for direct support of the program. Since that time funds to support the program have been reduced.

Administering the program requires direct support for such activities as annual planning conferences, planning meetings, seminars, spirit of residency activities, induction ceremonies, and the development of curriculum materials and marketing/recruiting materials associated with the program.

Historically, approximately \$15,000/yr. has been spent on these activities, and accounted for separately as a part of the Graduate Program budget. When available funds are not exhausted on these high-priority activities, funds are sometimes available to support faculty travel to conferences where the cohort is required to attend. Approximately \$5,000/year was available in the past for such travel. As the budget was reduced, so too has this amount been reduced. Supporting faculty travel to conferences is the lowest priority within the budget.

Subject to availability, access to funds for travel requires active participation in the D@D program. Active participation is defined as being a joint faculty member, participating in two-thirds of the D@D meetings that occur on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursdays of each month (during the academic calendar year) from 2:00-2:30pm in AGLS 129, participating in the annual planning meeting, and contributing to the conduct of the program through such activities as: teaching required courses in the sequence whereby portions of the course are taught during the conference in question; providing leadership for administering the required qualifying exam; planning and conducting seminars at the conference; and carrying out other functions as agreed upon at the D@D meetings. Requests for funds to support travel to conferences on behalf of D@D Program should flow first through the D@D Management Team, and then through the Associate Department Head for Graduate Studies and Research.
