Summer Teaching – Rutherford and Murphy

The ALEC Summer Teaching Pay Policy was distributed (See Attachment A) Some feedback was received – but it was all positive. This is the final version of this document. Summer teaching schedules are due by the 27th so if you have summer teaching plans we need to know quickly. Money is being requested for teaching larger classes. Other classes might be funded, we just don't know yet.

Incentivizing Teaching Committee

Instructional/Equipment Enhancement Fee (IEEF) schedule was distributed (See Attachment B). How do we make teaching more entrepreneurial? We don't incentivize teaching like we do research. A committee will be formed of truly interested faculty to review the problem and propose solutions. We have discussed creating Faculty individual budgets for teaching. This could include a redistribution of workgroup funds. IEEF funds are very restricted. They can be used for course supplies and materials, equipment, guest speakers and GANTS. They cannot be used for faculty salaries, GATs, any faculty travel. Dr. Murphy encouraged faculty to look over the IEEF fees and determine if they are spending that amount per student. Some courses may be underfunded, and others may generate more income than they need. Someone asked the difference between lab fees and IEEF. Lab fees are not returned, departments have no access to them

On the other hand, Distance Education earnings have few restrictions. Differential Tuition and Teaching Replacement Fees may be used for Faculty Salaries, Travel, etc. Any entrepreneurial strategy for teaching will include Distance Education.

Murphy hopes that Dean Dooley will serve on this committee since she has direct access to the budget data, rules and regulations.

Dr. Rutherford said that Dr. Elliot has been asked for a departmental teaching budget balance sheet of IEEF and DE income and expenditures. This will be shared with faculty.

Dr. Murphy reminded faculty that the AIMS system is open. Data has been input by Clarice, Elke and Tanya. Review your data, input/correct entries before February 24th. The data should cover the 2011 calendar year. You should schedule your APR meeting with Dr. Elliot through Debbie as soon as possible. In addition to the other items, bring your proposed teaching schedule for Fall 2012 and Spring 2013 to the APR.

ALEC Summer Teaching Pay Policy

This policy, providing additional pay for tenured/tenure-track faculty members to improve the educational opportunities available to students in the summer, is contingent upon available funding.

Faculty members may request to participate by notifying the Head or Associate Heads. Priority for summer funding will be determined by course demand, core curriculum (no other course can be, or has been, substituted for that course), course evaluations, and previous course enrollment.

Faculty members who offer to teach in the summer will be paid based on the payment schedule below for each course delivered.

Faculty members teaching Study Abroad courses in the summer are eligible for SAEF funding; if SAEF funding is less than the payment schedule below, the difference will be paid by the department.

Funding from the College is being requested to support large classes (60+).

^{**}Courses must "make" State Minimum enrollment on the Census date, with a minimum of 10 UG, or 5G, to be considered for summer funding.

^{***}Funding is based on 3 credit courses, 2 credit courses will receive 2/3 payment, 1 credit, 1/3.

Instructional/Equipment Enhancement Fees

Education code §55.16 – Board Responsibility

These fees are used for equipment and software purchase, maintenance, and repair, modification of specialized instructional facilities and expenditures such as material/supplies, services/training, furnishings, and non-teaching salaries and fringe benefits associated with the support of instructional enhancement activities that include, but are not limited to, laboratories, lectures, projects, homework, course delivery, and classroom demonstrations which enhance the learning experience of students.
