Action/Discussion Items

- 1. Approval of Minutes from the February meeting Tim Murphy Motion was made to "Approve the January minutes as distributed." Motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Evaluating work experience for doctoral applicants Tim Murphy Open discussion. Some faculty members' votes are influenced by work experience and some are not. Some include university employment (e.g. assistantship) experience; some do not. All agree professional experience improves classroom discussion. Question is there a way we can inform our colleagues to evaluate work experience of the applicant more effectively? Ultimately, the collective judgment of the faculty is the best, most defensible, admission decision process. Is there some way to improve the quality of information about related professional experience we use in making these decisions?

Motion was made by John Rayfield, Second by Julie Harlin to "Require doctoral applicants to provide a separate statement describing their relevant professional work experience as part of their applications materials." Motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Murphy indicated this newly required statement of professional work experience will be listed as a requirement for admission on the website, available to reviewers through AIM, and discussed with applicants in all advising prior to the next admission review cycle.

3. Graduate Course Sequence/Rotation (Attachment A) – Tim Murphy
Dr. Lindner was not present, however, he asked Dr. Murphy to make a suggestion to revisit the course
rotation. Number of rooms do not match number of classes, there is overlapping of courses. Three-hour
block courses interfere with one another.

Update course rotation to list ALEC 625 (F2F) offered every spring. (Clarice will note the change).

- 4. Graduate Curriculum Committee Report Gary Briers
 - a. International Ag Course Rotation Manuel Pina Currently, Dr. Pina teaches ALEC 644 every fall and ALEC 645 every spring. He proposed to offer 646 in an "even spring" rotation with 624. Dr. Pina will continue to try to meet with faculty to formalize a rotation for all the international ag graduate courses.
- 5. Qualifying Examination Committee Report Gary Wingenbach Drs. Wingenbach, Moore and Strong met on this topic. There is not a lot of interest. It is suggested to remove from the agendas at this time.
