

COLLEGE STATION -- The TAMU Horse Judging Team won first place at the National Reining Horse Association Futurity Collegiate Judging Contest in Oklahoma City on Dec. 4.

The Aggie team led the competitive field of 16 collegiate teams, with West Texas A&M University finishing second; University of Wisconsin-River Falls, third;

Clemson University, fourth; and Northeastern Oklahoma A&M, fifth.

Members of the champion team are Erin Grace of Milton, Fla., Lauren Fulce of Irving, Adrienne Paquette of Plano, Leslie Wagner of McAllen, and Brooke Byrd of Helotes.

The A&M team was the only team with three members finishing in the top 10. Grace led with first place high individual, Fulce



finished third, Paquette scored sixth and Wagner, thirteenth.

"This contest was only the third competition for this group and in three outings they have finished second twice and now first," said Clay Cavinder, assistant professor and horse judging team coach. "I am extremely excited about their future. Their commitment, competitive drive and growing

confidence are making them a very dangerous team."

Earlier this fall, the team earned reserve champion at both the Grand National and World Championship Morgan Horse Show in Oklahoma City and at the Arabian Horse Judging Contest in Tulsa.

Jeannette Mawyer is assistant coach. Amy Stewart of Lake Jackson, Amanda Zuniga of Charlotte and Shellie Delluge of Fallon, Nev., also are members of the horse judging team but did not compete in this contest.

Dr. Ted Friend was named a Texas AgriLife Research Faculty Fellow.


Pauline Recek, senior office associate, and Kenton Lilie, research assistant at the Beef Center, each received the Department of Animal Science Outstanding Support Staff award.

Food Drive Contest

The Department of Animal Science hosted a teambased Food Drive Contest with all collected donations going towards the KBTX Food For Families Food Drive held on Dec. 9 to benefit the Brazos Valley Food Bank and area pantries.

1017 pounds of non-perishable food items and \$466 in monetary donations were collected from four teams. According to the food bank \$1 equals five pounds of food. Total food items and monetary donations, the department donated 3,347 pounds of food.
