Satterfield joins department as assistant professor

Dr. Carey Satterfield has been hired by the Texas A&M University Department of Animal Science as an assistant professor in the physiology of reproduction section effective Oct.1, 2009.

Satterfield's research interests are focused on the long-term consequences of maternal nutrition on fetal and postnatal growth and development using sheep as his primary animal model. In addition, Satterfield studies the role of nutraceuticals in fetal brown adipose tissue development and the ability of offspring to regulate their core body temperature during periods of cold stress. His teaching interests include general reproductive and placental physiology as well as fetal growth and development.

A three-time graduate of Texas A&M University, Satterfield received a bachelor's degree in Animal Science in 1999 followed by a master's and doctorate degree in physiology of reproduction in 2005 and 2008, respectively. He then completed postdoctoral studies in growth and nutrition at Texas A&M in 2009.

Satterfield is a member of the Society for the Study of Reproduction. He also is a recipient of the Dr. A.M. "Tony" Sorensen Jr. Achievement Award presented by the physiology of reproduction section.
