#### TAMU Meat Judging Team members receive awards

DAKOTA CITY, NEBRASKA -- Several members of the Texas A&M University Meat Judging Team were awarded during the International Intercollegiate Meat Judging Contest held at Tyson Foods in Dakota City, Nebraska on Nov. 15, 2009.

The A&M team competed in the meat judging contest, finishing ninth, with Melanie Moore (Meyersville) ranking eighth high individual and Bryan Weaver (Center Point) scoring 10th high individual.

Other team members are Gatlin Gray (Weatherford) and Jae Ebling (Plainview). The team is coached by Scott Langley (Round Rock), meat science graduate student.

Moore also was named a member of the 2009 Senior Division Meat Judging All American First Team and Weaver was chosen as a member of the 2009 Senior Division Meat Judging All American Second Team. Criterion to receive this recognition include individual rankings in the American Meat Science Association sponsored contests as well as academic achievement.

Team member Jae Ebling (Plainview) was awarded the Rachel Hamilton Spirit Award. This award was established to honor a member of each team selected by their peers whose winning approach exemplifies Rachel Hamilton's love of meats judging.

SAN ANGELO, TEXAS – The Texas A&M University Wool Judging Team won first place at the Texas Invitational Contest held at Angelo State University Nov. 21, 2009.

The Texas A&M team beat second place Texas Tech University by 16 points. Angelo State finished third. New Mexico State University and Colorado State University also participated.

Twelve out of the 13 A&M team members placed among the top 22 individuals, with Claire Luensmann (LaVernia) winning high individual. Teammates Katie Muehlstein (Kerrville) finished third high individual and Jake Reed (Copperas Cove), Kim Hardin (Seattle, WA) and Stephanie Mazurkiewicz (Bryan) finished fourth, fifth and sixth, respectively.

Other team members include Callie Whitworth (Junction), Laura Stapper (Ozona), Katy Knox (LaPorte), Ashleigh Sowell (Anderson), Zac Goodwin (Alvarado), Josh Behrens (Voca), Kyle Phillips (Vidor) and Steele Ingham (Sonora).
