RanchTV educational Web site launched

COLLEGE STATION – The Texas AgriLife Extension Service has launched the RanchTV online learning center Web site to extend educational resource

and information to beef cattle producers via the Internet.

The Web site, developed by Extension Meat Specialist Dr. Dan Hale with the help of Bryan Waters of Solutions by Waters, offers more than 150 short videos on beef cattle industry topics. The site can be reached at http://ranchtv.org.

"The goal of the online digital library is to provide cattle producers easy access to information that will help their bottom line and teach

best management practices," Hale said.

In 2009, the Meat Science and Beef Cattle Extension groups developed two online learning centers, Hale said.

"This was accomplished using video from past projects sponsored by the Texas Beef Council," he said. "Both learning centers are part of a digital strategy to provide educational tools and resources to the over 100,000 cattle producers in the state of Texas, as well those across the United States."

The beef quality and safety digital learning strategy includes a digital video library called RanchTV (RanchTV.org) and a series of online training courses packaged together at CowsenseU (CowsenseU.org).

The online Beef Quality Assurance training for the Texas Beef Quality Producer Program is the flagship course for CowsenseU, Hale said.

From low-stress cattle handling to food safety and grid marketing, RanchTV includes info about almost every aspect of beef production.

"RanchTV will be an evolving online learning center for cattle producers, with many more videos scheduled to be added over the year," Hale said.



RanchTV topics include:

- Beef Quality Assurance.
- Carcass Grid Marketing & Meats.
- Cattle Evaluation.
- Cull Cow Management.
- Environment and Biosecurity.
- Food Safety.
- Health.
- Horses.
- Low-stress Handling of Livestock.

- Transporting Cattle.
- Youth Beef Cattle Projects.

"It is the goal to continually add new videos on the latest issues facing the beef cattle industry," Hale said.

The RanchTV online learning center was developed in part through the checkoff funds provided by the Texas Beef Council.


Nobel Peace Prize Winner Dr. Norman E. Borlaug dies

COLLEGE STATION – Dr. Norman E. Borlaug, Nobel Peace Prize winner and Distinguished Professor of International Agriculture, died September 12, 2009. Dr. Borlaug received the 1970 Nobel Peace Prize for developing high-yielding, disease-resistant wheat used to prevent famine in developing countries throughout the world. Borlaug was Distinguished Professor of International Agriculture in the Department of Soil and Crop Science. His career was dedicated to using science to combat world hunger. A public memorial service will be held October 6, 2009, at 11 a.m. in Rudder Auditorium on the Texas A&M University campus in College Station. SCURRY – More than 150 people from 10 Texas counties attended the annual Statewide 4-H Hippology Contest to be tested on all things "horse." The contest was held August 29, 2009, in Scurry, Texas, and was hosted by Dr. Brett Scott, AgriLife Extension Horse Specialist, Kaufman County 4-H Agent Carrie Sharp and Van Zandt County 4-H Agent Tommy Phillips. The contest included five parts: Station ID i.e. parts of the horse, breeds of horses, leg and face markings; a short exam; slide show quiz; one halter and one performance class; and one team question.
