Texas A&M AgriLife honors animal science personnel

Friend named AgriLife Research Faculty Fellow

COLLEGE STATION – Dr. Theodore Friend, professor in the Department of Animal Science, was honored as a Texas AgriLife Research Faculty Fellow at the 2010 AgriLife Conference held Jan. 11-15, 2010.


Friend's research on animal well-being issues has often served as the scientific basis on which legislators and other decision makers rely to respond to public concerns regarding practices in animal agriculture programs.

"Results from his studies have impacted regulations concerning transportation, management, or housing to improve the well-being of horses, swine, cattle, and poultry, as well as circus elephants and tigers," according to his citation.

He has testified before the U.S. Congress regarding animal well-being issues and has been interviewed by ABC, CNN, HBO, and National Geographic Explorer.

In the past five years, he has successfully directed the graduate studies of 13 graduate students, and has authored 20 publications in refereed journals, 16 in non-peer-reviewed publications and authored two book chapters. He has served as the principal investigator on 12 grants totaling or each more than \$700,000 and as investigator on 11 other grants.

On campus, Friend advises the Elephant Walk planning committee on transporting the elephants in a safe and appropriate manner and he advises the Parsons Mounted Cavalry on the transport of horses.



COLLEGE STATION – Dr. Andy Herring, assistant department head for academic programs in animal science and beef cattle scientist with Texas AgriLife Research, has received a 2009 Vice Chancellor's Award for graduate teaching.

The Vice Chancellor's Awards recognize outstanding achievements by faculty and staff in Texas A&M AgriLife agencies. The awards were presented at the 2010 AgriLife Conference.

Herring was recognized for outstanding work in graduate teaching of advanced beef production and quantitative

genetics. He was also recognized for outstanding research in these areas.

Herring has been with Texas A&M since 2002 as an associate professor in animal science.

The award was presented at the Texas AgriLife Conference.

Receiving the award was the McGregor Bovine Genomics Team comprised of Dr. Clare Gill, Dr. Andy Herring, Dr. Rhonda Miller, Dr. Penny Riggs, Dr. James Sanders and Dr. Jason Sawyer. The team has been recognized nationally and internationally, in both scientific and commercial sectors, for their efforts to identify genes that affect production efficiency in beef cattle, according to the nomination.

Hulsman's presentation was entitled, "Identification of a Major Gene That Interacts with MCIR to Modify Black Coat Color in a Nellore-Angus F_2 Population." She is working under the direction of Dr. Clare Gill.


Paul Maulsby, Beef Center manager, and the Beef Center staff presented information targeted at the first time show exhibitor as well as the experienced.
