SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES FOR WESTERN LAB

Correct seat at all gaits

Posting trot with demonstration of correct diagonal without looking

Changes of diagonal

Two-point position at trot

Forehand pivots- both directions

Sidepass- both directions

Reinback

Leg Yield- both directions

Hindquarter pivots- both directions

Rollbacks on fence

Simple lead changes in figure-eight

Flying lead changes (optional)

Count steps/strides at jog/lope

Ride one-handed correctly

Lengthen and shorten stride at jog and lope

Ride jog circle with counter-bend

These specific objectives are to be demonstrated by the student at some point during the semester. Each student must demonstrate some proficiency of each objective in order to receive credit.
