To look for lost and found pets, sign up as a foster home or to volunteer, register at www.petfinder.com.

To report a lost pet or one needing rescue, call 800-HUMANE1.

To locate foster homes for pets, call 800-485-5152.

Document and report all farm property losses to Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) at 800-621-3362 or www.fema.gov.
