# ASSISTANTSHIP AWARDED TO COED



The Department of Recreation and Parks at Texas A&M University has announced award of a Graduate Assistantship for study in Recreation and Resources Development for the 1970-71 academic year to MISS LUCIA R. JUENGER of Belleville, Illinois.

In making the announcement, DR. LESLIE M. REID, Head of the Department, said "Awards for graduate study are made on the basis of demonstrated academic ability. Graduate assistantships are made on an open competitive basis, and Miss Juenger is the first woman applicant to receive a graduate assistantship in this program."

The Belleville, Illinois, native obtained her secondary education at the Academy of Notre Dame, an Associate B.S. degree at Belleville Junior College, and the B.S. degree in Recreation at Southern Illinois University.

Miss Juenger was the recipient of numerous high school and college awards and recognitions. She is listed in "Who's Who in American Junior Colleges", a member of Phi Theta Kappa and Phi Kappa Phi honorary scholastic societies, selected "Outstanding Undergraduate Student", Recreation Club officer, and Dean's List recognition both as a Junior and Senior at Southern Illinois University.

Included in her list of hobbies and interests are: camping, kiking, travel, ecology, conservation, and horseback riding. She has attended numerous national and regional conferences and workshops dealing with conservation ecology and the wise use of natural resources, and has been employed as a camp counselor and nature instructor.

"My principal interest," said Miss Juenger, "is providing opportunities for outdoor recreation experiences while maintaining ecological excellence. I am grateful that Texas A&M University has a program that is a leader in this field, and that I have the opportunity to study here."

#### FOURTH DOCTORATE AWARDED

DR. JAY S. WILLIAMS, a native Texan, graduated with the Ph.D. in Recreation and Resources Development. Married, with two sons and two daughters, Dr. Williams is currently Director of Parks and Recreation for the City of Bryan, Texas. He served in a similar capacity for the cities of Alice and Temple, was an Instructor in the Department of Recreation and Parks at Texas A&M, and continues to be active in the Southwest Football and Basketball Officials Associations.



MISS EVA ZWEIFEL, a senior student and a technical assistant with the Department of Recreation and Parks, spent the summer conducting research in Washington, D.C. Her basic objective was to compile source material and research references at the National Reference Center of the National Recreation and Park Association.
