Randel Designated as Recipient of Distinguished Service Award

DALLAS, TEXAS (February 2-5, 2008) - Dr. Ronald D. Randel, Regents Professor and Senior Texas AgriLife Research Fellow in the Physiology of Reproduction Section of the Department of Animal Science based at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research Center in Overton, was designated as the recipient of the Distinguished Service Award by the American Society of Animal Science's Southern Section. The Southern Section recognizes and honors one of its members for outstanding service to the livestock industry each year. Randel received this award at the annual meeting of the American Society of Animal Science Southern Section, which was held in conjunction with the 105th Annual Meeting of the Southern Association of Agricultural Scientists.

Sterle Receives Young Animal Scientist Award

DALLAS, TEXAS (February 2-5, 2008) - Dr. Jodi Sterle, Associate Professor and Extension Swine Specialist in the Physiology of Reproduction Section of the Department of Animal Science, received the Young Animal Scientist - Education Award at the American Society of Animal Science Southern Section annual meeting. Nominees for the award must have made an outstanding contribution in education in the field of Animal Science; these accomplishments may be in the public, industry, and/or private sectors. Sterle develops educational programming related to swine production to serve a diverse clientele including the youth show pig industry, independent commercial producers, and the large vertically-integrated operations. She teaches honors and laboratory sections of the Introductory Animal Science course, and has developed a new course entitled "The Art and Heritage of Livestock".

McCollum Wins Extension Award

DALLAS, TEXAS (February 2-5, 2008) - Dr. Ted McCollum, Professor and Extension Beef Cattle Specialist in the Department of Animal Science stationed in Amarillo, won the Extension Award at the American Society of Animal Science Southern Section annual meeting.
