Department Animal Science Hosts American Angus Association® Cattlemen's Boot Camp

COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS (August 22-23, 2008) - The Department of Animal Science hosted over 60 beef cattle producers attending the American Angus Association® Cattlemen's Boot Camp at the Beef Center and Rosenthal Meat Science & Technology Center. The camp is a learning opportunity for all cattle producers, including newcomers to the beef industry, as well as experienced producers. This year's participants traveled from four states to learn about all segments of production, both in the classroom and through hands-on opportunities. Topics covered include reproduction, nutrition, herd health, marketing, and producing a high-quality end product.

Dr. Bill Mies, Texas A&M Professor Emeritus in Beef Cattle Science, presented the keynote address discussing both customer service and producing a high-quality product that meets consumer demands. Other Texas A&M University experts giving presentations included Dr. Buddy Faries, Dr. Davey Griffin, Mr. Paul Maulsby, Dr. L. R. Sprott, and Dr. Tryon Wickersham. Industry experts providing expertise included Bill Bowman, American Angus Association®; Gary Fike, Certified Angus Beef, LLC; Ty Groshan, American Angus Association®; and Erin Johnston, Texas Beef Council.

The 2008 edition held on the campus of Texas A&M University marked the ninth Cattlemen's Boot Camp. Organization of the camp was a collaborative effort of the American Angus Association® and Texas A&M University. Additional funding for the Boot Camp was provided through the Angus Foundation. Over 165 contestants from 12 counties participated in the event that is comprised of five different components: station identification (parts of the horse, breeds of horses, leg and face markings, etc.); short exam; slide show quiz; one halter and one performance class; and one team question. This year's winning senior team, Tarrant County, was awarded a trip to compete at the National Western in Denver, CO. This event continues to be an extremely popular contest for Texas 4-H members and continues to grow in size every year. There currently is no district qualification for this contest, and it is open to both junior and senior 4-H members.
